



AIDS Walk Los Angeles Reveals New Downtown Route for October 23 Event 32nd annual AIDS Walk Los Angeles starts and ends in Grand Park and raises critically needed funds for APLA Health

(Los Angeles, CA; September 21, 2016)—<u>AIDS Walk Los Angeles</u> unveils a new <u>route</u> for this year's event, which takes place Sunday, October 23. The 10-kilometer (6.2-mile) walk will begin and end in Grand Park, located in the heart of Downtown Los Angeles, and the route will take walkers past such historic and architecturally rich landmarks as the Walt Disney Concert Hall, the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion, the Broad Museum, the Japanese American Museum, and many others.

The Walk, which is expected to draw many thousands of participants in its 32nd year, raises vital funds for the services and programs <u>APLA Health</u> provides to more than 14,000 people in Los Angeles County annually. Since its inception in 1985, AIDS Walk Los Angeles has raised more than \$82 million for

organizations that work to end the HIV epidemic and is one of the largest AIDS fundraising events in the country.

The Walk begins on the morning of Sunday, October 23, with Sign-In at 8:30 a.m. and the Opening Ceremony at 9:15 a.m., which will include celebrity supporters, live entertainment, and state and local officials. Past Opening Ceremonies have featured Paula Abdul, Jamie Lee Curtis, Mary Louise Parker, Drew Carey, Candis Cayne, Hal Sparks, Madonna, Michael Urie, George Takei, Lisa Vanderpump, Lea DeLaria, Danny Pintauro, and many more.

In addition, AIDS Walk Los Angeles is supported by many sponsors, including Premier Sponsors Gilead Sciences and Quest Diagnostics; Grand Sponsors ABC7, Delta Air Lines, Paul Hastings, and Paramount Pictures; and Principal Sponsors Anthem Blue Cross, Macy's, PepsiCo, and Toyota.

The event will conclude with special performances and food truck festivities at the Splash Fountain and Performance Lawn of Grand Park after participants complete the route.

The walk begins and ends in Grand Park. The 10K route travels through Little Tokyo, Pershing Square, the Jewelry District, the Fashion District, and other parts of Downtown L.A.

Parking information will be available soon on the AIDS Walk website. The start of the walk will take place just one block away from a major LA Metro stop, Grand Park/Civic Center, on the Red and Purple Lines.
